

WE MUST ALL FIGHT TO OVERTURN THE BAKKE DECISION!



# UC's 6 largest investments are in corporations that have become predominant in South Africa: IBM, GM, GE, Caltex, Ford, and ITT.

# The wage of a white miner is 420/month; the black miner's wage is 28 dollars a month.

312 million of UC's 1-billion dollar investment portfolio is invested in firms which support the South African government, accept apartheid and exploit black labor. The lucrative return on investment in South Africa derives from the exploitation and suffering of an enslaved black population.

# In South Africa, 17.6% of the total population, the white minority, have reserved for themselves 87% of the land, all of the cities, all of the ports, all of the good farm land, and most of the country's wealth.

# The Regents have consistently refused to accept advice on the social implications of corporate actions involving the university's multi-million-dollar investment porrtfolio.
