

Course work available through 1973 Summer Session

May 7, 1973

Course work ranging from anthropology to visual arts will be available through the 1973 Summer Session at the University of California, San*Diego.

Registration opens this week for the eight-week general session which begins June 25 with some 1,200 students expected to sign up for classes on the UCSD campus. Registration is open up to the start of classes and may be made by mail or in person.

Students will be able to choose from among a variety of `regular` courses including work in such academic areas as anthropology, biology, history, literature, mathematics, music, philosophy, physical education, psychology, and sociology.

Included among the course titles are a variety of topics including-, "Introduction to the Study of Man, The Nature of the Universe; Radio, Television and Society, The History of Mexico; History of China in Recent Decades; An Introduction to the Oceans; Shakespeare: Tragedies and Romance; Introductory and Intermediate Swimming; Knowing the World in Words; and Beginning Camera Technique."

In addition, the session will provide a variety of enrichment courses, lectures and workshops for teachers and other adults who want to upgrade and supplement previous training.

A wide range of special interest programs, aimed at a more selective audience, will also be offered. These include:

- Intensive Organic Chemistry, a program in modern organic chemistry which is of particular relevance for biology majors and medical school aspirants.

- Intensive Physical Chemistry, a program comprised of the lecture courses in physical chemistry, also of particular interest to biology majors and pre-medical students.

- Ocean Studies, a program including an introductory oceans course, marine biology and marine geology and geophysics.

- Language courses in Chinese and Japanese taught by experienced language teachers who are native speakers and trained linguists. These programs of study include extra-curricular activities that complement the language and culture study.

- Intensive Language Program Abroad in France or Spain, a unique opportunity to become proficient in French or Spanish and to live and travel abroad while receiving university credit. The Spanish program will be held in Madrid, the French program in Paris.

- German Language Workshops, a program designed for graduates and undergraduates preparing for reading and proficiency exams as well as anyone interested in learning German.

- Summer Chamber Music Institute, a special four-week project course in chamber music performance under the direction of Rafael Druian, Concertmaster of the New York Philharmonic.

- A multi-dimensional exploration of films under the joint direction of the UCSD Visual Arts Department and the Communications Program. Three sections - one on thrillers, one on the director (Alfred Hitchcock), and a film production workshop will be offered.

- Language and Education Summer Workshop, a program offering courses and practical field experiences intended for teachers in multicultural classrooms.

Fees for the eight-week general session are \$100 for one course and \$200 for two or more courses. Fees for special courses vary with each course. A Student Health Service fee of \$10 is also required.
