SATURDAY NIGHT LIVE COMEDY COMES TO UCSD

"Saturday Night Live" comedians David Spade and Adam Sandler will perform at the University of California, San Diego's Price Center Theater on Saturday, May 30 at 8 p.m.

Sandler performs several different characters and impersonations for Saturday Night Live including boxer Hector "macho" Camacho and singer Axel Rose. He is best known for his character "Iraqi Pete" who taunts TV viewers with his anti-American propaganda.

Sandler admits that although he was a class clown during his school days, pursuing comedy as a profession never entered his mind. At the age of 17, after some coaxing from his brother, he went on stage at a comedy club in Boston and shortly afterwards, turned professional.

Like Sandler, Spade performs frequently as a correspondent for Saturday Night Live's "Weekend Update." He is renowned for his uncanny impersonations of actor Michael J. Fox and singers Tom Petty and Gunner Nelson.

Spade has performed at comedy theaters and colleges across the nation for more than six years. He got his big career break when he was offered a co-starring role in the film "Police Academy 4." He was named as 1991's "Hot Stand-up" comedian by Rolling Stone magazine, and has also appeared on NBC's "Tonight Show," and several prime time situation comedies.
