

Noted Violinist Rafael Druian to conduct series of concerts featuring UCSD Chamber Orchestra

Noted violinist Rafael Druian will conduct a series of three concerts featuring the University of California, San Diego Chamber Orchestra to be given in July at Sherwood Hall, La Jolla.

The "Concerts By the Sea" are scheduled for Wednesday, July 3; Monday, July 15, and Saturday, July 27, and will include performances by several guest artists.

The orchestra is composed of approximately 40 musicians who are participating in UCSD's fourth annual Chamber Music Institute, a five-week course in chamber music performance.

Druian, current concertmaster of the New York Philharmonic, will conduct the institute for the fourth summer.

Harpsichordist Anthony Newman will perform Bach's "Concerto for Harpsichord in D Minor" in the opening concert at 8 p.m. July 3. The program will also include Mozart's "Divertimento No. 11 in D Major," Frederick Delius' "Summer Night on the River," and Dvorak's "Serenade for Winds."

Newman holds degrees from the Mannes College of Music, Harvard University and Boston University. He won first prize in composition in the 1964 International Competition in Nice and is currently recording all of Bach's works for harpsichord.

Druian and Stefan Krayk will perform Bach's "Concerto for 2 Violins in D Minor" in the second concert at 8 p.m. July 15. Druian will also be featured in Mozart's "Concerto No. 3 for Violin in G Major." The concert will conclude with Allessandro Scarlatti's "Concerto No. 3 in F Major for Strings and Harpsichord" and Haydn's "Symphony No. 44 in E Minor."

Krayk, professor of music at UC Santa Barbara, has been a soloist with the Chicago Symphony, the BBC Symphony in England and the Warsaw Philharmonic.

Druian, who will. join the UCSD music faculty this fall, has also served as concertmaster of the Minneapolis and Dallas Symphonies and the Cleveland Orchestra.

In the final concert at 3 p.m. July 27, featured guest artist will be French hornist Barry Tuckwell who will perform Mozart's "Horn Concerto No. 4 in E flat." Also performing will be Edwin Harkins and Jack Logan who will be highlighted in Vivaldi's "Concerto in C Major for Two Trumpets." Logan will also play Vincent Persichetti's "The Hollow Men for Trumpet and String Orchestra."

Rounding out the program will be Ives' "Symphony No. 3" and Ravel's "Le Tombeau de Couperin."

Tuckwell, former principal horn player with the London Symphony and the Philharmonic Orchestra, has made numerous appearances with chamber groups and leading orchestras throughout the world. Trumpeters Harkins and Logan are San Diego musicians.

Series tickets are \$12 for three concerts. Individual admission is \$5 per concert. Patron tickets may also be purchased for the series at \$30 each.
