As a public institution in California, UCSD has academics, staff and students with different

culture and life experience that contribute a lot to the university's enormous diversity. People

here make great effort to foster mutual respect and cross-cultural cooperation. Various activities

and courses about history and culture of different ethnicities deepen our understanding of each

other. I was impressed by the friendly atmosphere in UCSD.

However, even though discrimination doesn't exist in most part of the university community,

discrepancy between identities and ingrained misunderstandings often lead to bias towards

certain groups of people. For example, Asian Americans were called "model minorities" by the

mainstream society for their relatively high income and comfortable lives since the 1960s. This

incomprehensive comment hurt the relations between Asian Americans and other minorities

severely. Asian Americans are placed at an awkward position in American society for they are

neither "white enough" to get the same benefits as whites get nor "struggle enough" to protest

together with blacks and other minorities. I think that's why APSA couldn't cooperate with other

organizations like BSU and NASA effectively and satisfy their own demands after the racist

events in UCSD.

This reading didn't change my view of UCSD. I still think in UCSD, diversity is well respected. I met many kind and friendly people in UCSD and they made me feel not excluded by the university community for my bad English and cultural background. In addition, there are many policies and activities about equity, diversity, and inclusion. Although they could be seen as implication of incomplete equality, these policies reflect USCD community's effort to create a conclusive atmosphere here.
