

## **UCSD Department of Philosophy to host seminar in "Law, Women, and Rights in Classical Antiquity" on Feb. 10-11**

The Department of Philosophy will host a two-day conference on classical history and philosophy during the 5th century B.C., titled "Law, Women and Rights in Classical Antiquity," on Feb. 10-11, at the University of California, San Diego.

The participants are Avrum Stroll and Georgios H. Anagnostopoulos, UCSD Department of Philosophy; Marianne McDonald, UCSD Professor of Theatre; Alden Mosshammer, UCSD Professor of History; Gerasimos Santas, UC Irvine; Robert Wallace, Northwestern University; Anthony Long, UC Berkeley, and David Cohen, UC Berkeley.

The first presentation on Feb. 10 will take place from 2-5 p.m. in the Formal Lounge, Revelle Commons, at Revelle College. The lecturers will be Gerasimos Santas, speaking on "Law, Justice, and Women in Plato's Republic," and Georgios Anagnostopoulos, who will talk about "Authority Without Law in Plato and Aristotle." The moderator will be Avrum Stroll.

The second presentation on Feb. 10 will take place from 8-10 p.m. in Room 111A, Chancellor's Complex. The lecturer will be Robert Wallace, who will talk on "Sex in Context: Moral Legislation in the Greek World." The moderator will be Marianne McDonald.

On Feb. 11, at 9:30 a.m., in the Revelle Formal Lounge, Robert Wallace will speak on "Freedom and the Right of Citizens in Athenian Democracy," followed by Anthony Long, who will lecture on "Stoic Philosophers on Community, Self-Interest, and Private Property." The moderator will be Alden Mosshammer.

The second presentation on Feb. 11 will be held from 2-5 p.m. in the Revelle Formal Lounge. The speakers will be David Cohen, on "Democracy and Rights in Classical Athens," and Marianne McDonald, who will lecture on "Women's Wrongs Righted or Reflected in Greek Drama: Women and the Athenian Law in Fifth Century B.C." The moderator will be Georgios Anagnostopoulos.
