UCSD OPEN HOUSE TO BE HELD MAY 3

Once again the University of California, San Diego will welcome the San Diego community when it celebrates the annual campus Open House, Sunday, May 3, from noon to 5 p.m.

There will be music, food, campus tours, laboratory tours, demonstrations, lectures, a Renaissance Faire and a cultural celebration among the many scheduled activities.

Open House offers the chance to see what goes on in various working laboratories, hear world renowned experts talk about subjects ranging from current astronomical research, to the latest from the world of medical research on fitness and aging.

Tours will be offered of the general campus in both English and Spanish. In addition, tours to particular locations of special campus interest such as the

San Diego Supercomputer Facility and the outdoor sculptures of the Stuart Collection will be available. The Central Library, a campus landmark, will also be open for tours, exhibits and demonstrations of its computerized catalog system.

Scripps Institution of Oceanography will present exhibits highlighting research. Lectures are also available on recent research in the arctic and on diving expeditions under the Antarctic ice. The Scripps Aquarium and Museum will also be open. A free shuttle bus will be running continuously between the main UCSD campus and the Scripps Institution of Oceanography.

Prospective students and their parents will have the opportunity to meet faculty from various departments and learn more about the academic and social environment at UCSD. Representatives from admissions, financial aid and scholarships, and other student services will be on hand to answer any questions about enrollment or requirements for admission.

The physical education and recreation departments will offer fitness testing, along with aerobics and dance demonstrations.

There will be music everywhere with performances by pianist Cecil Lytle, Jimmy Cheatham and his jazz band, the Wind Ensemble, the Japanese Taiko Drummers, the UCSD Gospel Choir, Danza Mexicayotl -- Aztec dances performed beneath the famed "Sun God" sculpture -- and many other groups.

Step back in history at the always popular Renaissance Faire at Revelle College or tour the world at the Third College Cultural Celebration, which features music, arts and fashions from our international neighbors.

Everyone is invited to bring a picnic lunch or sample a smorgasbord of foods from traditional American hot dogs to culinary delights from around the world.
