

Ambassador Robert Krueger to lecture

Ambassador Robert Krueger, ambassador-at-large to Mexico and United States coordinator for Mexican affairs, will speak at 10 a.m. Tuesday, Feb. 5, at the University of California, San Diego.

Krueger will speak to students in the Revelle Formal Lounge on the Revelle campus. The public may attend the free lecture.

Krueger, a Shakespearean scholar, received his doctorate at Oxford University after earning his master's degree from Duke University. He was an associate professor, vice provost and dean of the college of arts and sciences at Duke until 1973, when he returned to his home in New Braunfels, Texas, to assume the family businesses.

Krueger served two terms in the House of Representatives as congressman from his district. He was appointed ambassador-at-large last June by President Carter, who cited the "increasing domestic and international importance of our relationship with Mexico" in making the appointment.

Krueger's talk at UC San Diego is sponsored by the University's Department of Political Science.
