

"A Love Song for Miss Lydia" to be performed

The Southern California Black Repertory Company production of "A Love Song for Miss Lydia" will be performed at 8 p.m. Wednesday, May 30, in the Mandeville Recital Hall at the University of California, San Diego.

The new Don Evans play, directed by Dr. Floyd Gaffney of the UC San Diego Department of Drama, is being performed at the Second Avenue Theater, 863 Second Ave., at 8 p.m. May 24-27 and May 31 through June 3, with matinees scheduled at 2 p.m. Sunday.

Tickets to the UC San Diego and the Second Avenue Theater shows are \$4 general admission and \$3 for students, military and senior citizens. Tickets to the UC San Diego show will be sold at the door.

"A Love Song for Miss Lydia" is a two-act drama about a lonely 72-year-old widow who advertises for a roomer to share her home. The cast includes Anasa Briggs, Alyce Cooper, Saundra Franklin, James Avery and Robert Miller.

The Black Repertory Company performance marks the premiere of the Evans play. Evans, whose other plays include "Sugar-Mouth Sam Don't Dance No More," "Orrin," "Matters of Choice" and the upcoming Broadway musical "Mahalia," will be in San Diego during the final week of rehearsal.
