## Dr. Geoffrey Barraclough will speak

"History in a Changing World" will be the topic for Dr. Geoffrey Barraclough, Professor of History at the University of California, San Diego, when he speaks to Friends of the Library on November 1, 8:00 p.m., in room 2722 of the University's Undergraduate Sciences Building.

Formerly of Cambridge University in England, Professor Barraclough is presently teaching medieval and world history at the University.

He received the Master of Arts degree from Oxford and is a fellow of Merton College, Oxford. He also studied at the British School of Rome, Italy, and did research at the University of Munich, Germany. He has taught at St. John's College, Cambridge University and the University of Liverpool.

Professor Barraclough, who succeeded Arnold Toynbee as Director of the Royal Institute of International Affairs, has a long list of published works. His most recent book is "An Introduction to Contemporary History." Among his best known are: "History in a Changing World," "The Medieval Empire: Idea and Reality;" and "The Origins of Modern Germany."

Following the talk, elections will be held for a new Council to hold office through October 31, 1967. The Council, in turn, will elect the officers of the Friends. Brief reports will be given to sum up the activities of the year.
