BACKGROUND: The first annual egg drop competition at UCSD will test the design skills of Muir College students. Each egg will be encased in materials selected from a kit of potential materials; only the designs of the egg crates will be different. No need to judge for style points here. The condition of the egg will determine the winner or winners. Other awards will be given for the most creative crate, the funniest crate and the ugliest crate.

Prizes will include fabulous munchies and the honor and prestige that naturally goes along with winning such an event.
