The muoh disoussed and cussed road still unpaved within the oity limits of El Cajon is about to be paved. This was determined by a large gathering at the sohool house Thursday night.

Mr. F. M. White and Col. Ed Fletcher, members of the County Highway Commisaion informed the gathering that the City of El Cajon was the only city that had so far failed to fulfill its pledge of two years ago, to build the highway within the ofty limits of El Cajon, providing the county highway was constructed via Santee to Lakeside. Mr. White called particular attention to the fact that the Board of Supervisors could spend no county money inside the city limits of El Cajon, neither could the County Highway Commission. The City of El Cajon has voted $\$ 4,000$ in bonds which money is now available. The rest of the money, ie: $\$ 5,000$ mast be raised by outside subscriptions.

Col. Fletcher vas then asked to take charge of the meeting and reported the following subsoriptions that he had received Thursday:

Kibbey of Lakeside was appointed ohairman of a committee to solioit funds at Lakeside. Messrs. Cowles, Ballantyne and Holder were selected as the committee from Santee Messrs. Edw. Mueller, G. L. Strobeok and J. A. McKinnon were appointed as the committee from El Cajon. Mr. Sherwood Wheaton was unanimously selected as treasurer of the funds.

It is believed that all the funds necessary to build the missing link in the City of El Cajon will be raised with in two weeks from date.
