

18 Artists Come to San Diego, exhibition by graduate students in the visual arts department

The works of new graduate students in the Department of Visual Arts at the University of California, San Diego, will be featured in an exhibition entitled "18 Artists Come to San Diego," opening Monday, November 29, in the Mandeville Annex Gallery on the campus.

The public is invited to an opening reception for the artists in the gallery at 5 p.m. Monday, November 29. The exhibition will continue through Friday, December 3. Gallery hours are noon to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

"18 Artists Come to San Diego" is curated by the students themselves. The work in this show reflects widely divergent approaches to subject matter and media, due in part to the artistic concerns that each artist has brought from different parts of the country. Visitors to the exhibition will find work from several regional traditions. Students have come to UCSD from Chicago, New York, San Francisco, Sacramento, Montreal, Minnesota and Mississippi. One student is from Sweden.

The media in which these students work range from sculpture to painting to film, video and photography. Most of the work is a combination of these genres.
