

## **3rd World Studies presents Mexican-American and China lectures**

Public lectures on two widely diverse subjects - Mexican-Americans and China - will be presented by the Third World Studies Program of Third College at the University of California, San Diego, Monday and Wednesday, April 3 and 5.

Rosaura Sanchez, an Assistant Instructor in the Department of Spanish and Portuguese at the University of Texas in Austin, will talk on "Mexican-Americans and the Teaching of Spanish" at 4:00 p.m. Monday, April 3, in Conference Room A, Building 111 on the Matthews Campus.

Dr. Winston Hsieh, Professor in the Department of History at the University of Washington in Seattle, will talk on "China and the Third World Studies" at 4:00 p.m. Wednesday, April 5. in Building 201, Matthews Campus.

Dr. Hsieh is associated with the Institute for Comparative and Foreign Area Studies at the University of Washington and is also co-editor of the "Bulletin for Chinese Local Studies." His talk at UCSD will include special reference to his studies in the Chinese revolution, social change, and overseas emigration to Southeast Asia and America and to the internationally operated Canton Delta Project under his direction.

Both lectures are free and open to the public.
