

Bella Lewitsky, dancer and choreographer will perform at UCSD

The company of Bella Lewitsky, an internationally renowned dancer/ choreographer who has chosen to pursue her craft almost entirely on the West Coast, will appear at 8:30 p.m., Saturday, October 18, at the Mandeville Auditorium, University of California, San Diego.

Ms. Lewitsky, says dance critic Walter Terry, is "a superb teacher an American dance legend . . . a major choreographer . . . a great dancer." Through her co-founding of the Lester Horton Dance Theater in Los Angeles and later through the establishment of her own dance company, she has become a West Coast "underground legend."

The Lewitsky company is one of four which will appear in the dance series of the UCSD Campus Program Board during the 1975-76 academic year season. The other companies are the Polish Mime Ballet Theatre which will perform on February 1; the Utah Repertory Dance Theatre, which will perform on April 25; and the Rod Rodgers Dance Company, which will perform on May 15. Tickets for the dance series are \$9 for UCSD students and \$15 for the general public.

Tickets for the Lewitsky company performance are \$3 for UCSD students and \$4.50 for general admission.
