

One-day symposium on language and literature for high school teachers to be held

December 1, 1980

A one-day symposium on language and literature for high school teachers, sponsored by the Department of Literature at the University of California, San Diego, will be held Saturday, December 13, in the Humanities-Library Building on the Revelle College campus at UC San Diego.

The symposium, which is open to all city and county high school English and language teachers, will feature lecture and work sessions on English composition, the uses of creative writing in the literature curriculum, research in the humanities, teaching the great books, and new directions in foreign language teaching.

Faculty members in the Department of Literature will serve as symposium leaders and lecturers.

Registration is scheduled for 9 a.m. Opening remarks, scheduled for 9:30 a.m., will be given by Dr. James K. Lyon, chairman of the Department of Literature at UC San Diego. Luncheon remarks will be delivered by Dr. Richard C. Atkinson, UC San Diego chancellor.

The symposium will conclude with a tour of library research areas on the UC San Diego campus at 3 p.m. and a social hour scheduled for 3:30 p.m.
