Registration opens Dec. 1 for UC San Diego Extension winter quarter classes. More than 200 full-length and short courses will be offered during the Jan. 5 March 19 term.

History, psychology, business and health programs are receiving special attention on the winter curriculum. Extension will offer "The Adams Chronicles, a course in connection with the Bicentennial television series viewing U. S. social and political history between 1750 and 1900 through the story of the Massachusetts family which contributed two presidents. The television portion begins Jan. 20 on KPBS-Channel 15.

Explore also lists two Saturday tours of San Diego. Excursions through Victorian San Diego, and into the East County back country to visit hot springs, gold mines and historic areas are features of these Bicentennial programs.

Seven weekend seminars in the areas of self-improvement and self-awareness will be presented, including "Introduction to Creative Problem Solving" on January 30-31. Dr. Sidney J. Parness of the New York-based Creative Education Foundation will come to UC San Diego to lead this program designed to assist parents, teachers, health professionals and managers with challenges of everyday living.

The Extension conversation series, "Some Interesting Evenings with Interesting People," now in its third year, will be hosted by Dr. Jonathan Saville, associate professor of literature at UCSD and reviewer for the Reader. Internationally known concert violinist Zina Schiff, and astronomer Margaret Burbidge, now of UCSD and formerly director of the Greenwich Observatory, will be among the famous guests.

Treatment of social issues in films will be topics of two cinema courses.
