

Professor Joel Hurstfield will be 13th speaker in Friends of the UCSD Library Public Events Series

Professor Joel Hurstfield, visiting fellow at the Henry Huntington Library in San Marino and an expert in the history of Tudor England, Shakespeare and Elizabeth 1, will be the thirteenth speaker in the Friends of the UCSD Library Public Events Series at 8 p.m. Monday, Jan. 16, in the lobby of the Central University Library.

Hurstfield was educated at the University College of London and holds a Doctor of Literature degree. He has been a lecturer at the University College of Southampton, official historian for the Offices of War Cabinet, visiting professor to the United States from the University of London, senior research fellow at the Folger Shakespeare Library, Washington, D.C. and John Coffin Memorial Lecturer at the University of London.

Among his publications are "The Queen's Wards," 1958; "Elizabeth I and the Unity of England," 1960; "Shakespeare's World," 1964; "The Historian as Moralist: Reflections on the Study of Tudor England," 1975, and articles and reviews in The Times, Guardian, Economic Historical Review and Daily Telegraph.

The Friends of the UCSD Library is an educational organization which brings together San Diego residents with a common interest in books, libraries and promoting the development of the UC San Diego libraries. The Public Events Series has been planned to encourage greater contact with the university for members of the Friends and the general public.

The series is free and open to the public. Refreshments will be served preceding the program at 7:30 p.m.
