M^r. Auld told me this morning to write to you about three Cash entries that seemed to be wrong in the copies sent up for last quarter - Solis tells me that the four men who, as you told M^r. Auld, had no acct open in the Cas Part., told him that Cap^t. Habling had already arranged the matter in the Real, and that for that reason they were sure their money would be received -

Would it not be better to send me a list of the accts opened, and then I would refuse taking the money from any body who was not on the list?

I cannot find any letter from Vahu for the Iron he was credited for. Reid is ill, and the papers I have found in the almacén are of no use for clearing up the doubt - Nevertheless I send you ^{two} ~~three~~ "pases" and suppose that the letters belonging to them have been either lost or destroyed. In the cash we have only Reid's Boletos, serving as vouchers for the cash entries.

Kai's salary has been 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ a week since the beginning
of April. By a mistake of Torre's the two first weeks
were charged at 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ instead of 2 $\frac{1}{2}$, and therefore no
salary was charged for the two last weeks. I have
looked through both raya and Extracto books
and find it is right - You must have made a
mistake in the two last weeks of April. Still if
you wish it I will charge these 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ as extra salary.
As for the mair you will find in last week's
memoria, that every thing has been charged there
up to the 14 Inst.



According to your request I send you for your inspection a description of our journey to examine the woods belonging to the Haciendas of Concepcion & the disputed rights of Capula, the party who went are the following. Don Ignacio Gonzalez, Don Juan Espinoza administradores of San Javier & La Concepcion ^{Benito Morales} William Rabling & myself with an armed force of sixty men for the protection of our persons, it took us from the 14th to the 19th ult.

The woods joining the Concepcion that is to the eastern mountain called the Lagunilla & to the North and North west are principally composed of dwarf oak, with a few scattered pines, timber which is only useful for the Engines, notwithstanding I should think there are great many hundred thousands cargass but so badly situated in deep barrancas that it will require a deal of trouble & labour to get it out to the main road for conveyance to the Pachuca Mines, the distance from the abovementioned woods is about 2 to three leagues, over a pretty good road & I think the mules could go two journeys daily. ^{medianoamente bueno}

^{partes} Farther to the North & north west to a mountain called the Op de Agua there is a large quantity of wood composed of red & white pine, also some good sized oak trees useful for mining purposes the remainder for fuel, a person cannot possibly state what amount of cargass there are in these woods.

These mountains and woods ~~are~~ continue just in the same state or condition until they reach the Peña de Aguila or the commencement of the disputed rights of Capula, from this point to the mines of Capula is a dense forest both to the

North & South of the ^{principal} main road for the distance of 3 or 4 leagues to Capula or the barranca of Santa Rosa, this finca is supposed to be half the distance from Pachuca to Santa Rosa

at this place the woods are composed of pine & oak the major part being oak, of good size, fit for mining necessities, here it is an impossibility to form any calculation of the quantity of timber & fuel it contains as the woods are very dense, so that a person cannot ^{scarcely} walk through them

timber so plentiful but a great many difficulties to overcome as the roads are in a very bad condition, the distance from Pachuca to Capula is $\frac{1}{2}$ leagues too far for mules to go & return in one day with a carga, but should the Company think fit there is a house already built ^{at the} ~~of~~ ^{of} a de Agua with grounds suitable to hold any quantity of wood this place is about half the distance from Pachuca,

De conformidad con sus deseos mando a V. para su conocimiento una descripción de nuestra expedición para el examen de los mineros pertenecientes a la Hacienda de la Concepción y disputados por Capula.

Las personas que nos acompañaron fueron las siguientes: D. Ignacio Gonzalez, D. Juan Espinosa, administradores de S. Javier y la Concepción, Goro Rabling, Bernabe Boraes y el esponente, con una fuerza armada de sesenta hombres para la protección de nuestras personas, habiéndolos tomado del 17 al 19 del corriente.

Los montes pertenecientes a la Concepción tienen por termino al Este una montaña llamada la "Lagunilla" y al Norte y Nordeste estan compuestos principalmente de encinas, chaparros, con algunos pinos esparcidos, madera unicamente útil para la S. magnisimas. Sin embargo pienso que hay allí una gran cantidad de miles de miles de cargas, pero situadas de una manera tan mala en la profundidad de las barrancas, que seria necesario un trabajo y laboriosidad improbas para colocar la tierra en el

camino principal para aprovecharla en el camino de
~~Tachuca~~ las minas de Tachuca. La distancia de los
montes arriba mencionados es de dos a tres leguas de un
camino medianamente bueno y creo que las ruitas
podrán hacer dos viajes diarios.

Lejos de allí al Norte y Nordeste en una
montaña llamada el Ojo de Olgüo hay una gran
cantidad de madera compuesta de pino blanco y
colorado, como también encino de buenas dimen-
siones, útil para las necesidades de la minería.
Nadie podría calcular el número de cargas conteni-
das en estos bosques.

Estas montañas y bosques continúan
en el mismo estado y condición hasta llegar a la
punta del "Olgüo" o el principio de los derechos dispu-
tados por Capula, desde este punto a las minas de
capula es un bosque compacto, ~~pero~~ al Norte y Sur del
camino principal a distancia de 3 a 4 leguas de Capula
o la Barranca de Sta Rosa. La punta del Olgüo se
supone ser la mitad de la distancia entre Tachuca
y Sta Rosa. En este lugar los montes están com-
puestos de pino y encino formando el último la
mayor parte, de muy buenas dimensiones, propio
para las necesidades de la minería, allí es imposible
formar un cálculo de la cantidad de madera
porque la continuación de los bosques es muy
densa.

I am in receipt of your favor of
the 4th Inst^o.

You will allow me to refute in the most
energetic manner the very serious accusation
you bring against me of having sent an
anonymous intimation against any officer
of the Company, and that, enclosed in a
blank envelope. This latter was not blank
because I directed it in my own handwriting.

The advice was not anonymous being in my
own handwriting, and both under my seal
which is considered as good as, if not better, than
my signature. It was a private communi-
cation to Mr. Murray, because, it was not direc-
ted to the treasurer of the Company in Real
del Monte, and as he seems not to know
from where it came I to day send him up
the same paper with those explanations that
will not leave him the slightest doubt about what

I mean, I ever I have forgotten myself, it has
been when I could stand slander and insult, of the most
cowardly description, altho' not anonymous, as you
call it from Mr. Murray.

As I am not, and never have been in the secrets
of the Direction, I am not at all aware of the serious
misunderstandings that exist among the employees
of the Company. The only thing I know is that for
or perhaps five months ago I explained to you as
Director of the Company, how Mr. Murray in a
cowardly and underhand way tried to ruin me
in the opinion of the Company, writing official
calumnies about me; what did you do then altho'
you confessed that it was right? Nothing.

As once before you told me that for all things
belonging to the office under my charge, I had
