

Dr. Vincente Navarro will give two public lectures at UCSD

April 12, 1975

Dr. Vincente Navarro, renowned both nationally and internationally in the field of medicine and allied health fields, will give two public lectures on the politics of health care, Friday, April 18, at the University of California, San Diego.

The first, sponsored by the Department of Community Medicine of the UCSD School of Medicine, will be at 12:00 noon in room 2100 of the Basic Science Building. The topic will be "The Political Determinants of Health Care in the United States: the Analysis of the Feasible."

The second lecture, sponsored by the Urban and Rural Studies program of The Third College, will be at 4:00 p.m. in room 1330 of the Humanities and Social Sciences Building. The topic will be "Politics of Health Care in Developing Countries." Both lectures are free and open to the public.

Navarro is associate professor and associate director of the Comprehensive Health Planning Program at The Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, Maryland. He also holds the positions of associate professor in the Department of International Health and associate professor in the Department of Health Care Organization at Johns Hopkins. In addition, he currently serves as editor-in-chief of the quarterly publication "International Journal of Health Services. Planning, Administration, Evaluation."

Born in Barcelona, Spain, in 1937, Navarro received the degree of Doctor of Medicine and Surgery from the University of Barcelona in 1962. He received a Ph.D. in public health from Johns Hopkins in 1968.

He has served on the faculty and staff of universities and hospitals both in this country and in foreign countries including Sweden, Argentina, Puerto Rico and Colombia. He currently serves as a consultant to the Bureau of Health Services Research of HEW and to the Director General of the World Health Organization located in Geneva.

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
