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1997 VISUAL ARTS FACULTY EXHIBITION OPENS APRIL 9 AT UCSD

An exhibition of works by 15 members of the visual arts faculty at the University of California, San Diego will open April 9 at UCSD's University Art Gallery. A reading and performance by David Antin and Jerome Rothenberg will be presented at 5 p.m., followed by a reception for the artists from 6 to 8 p.m.

The 1997 Visual Arts Faculty Exhibition marks the 30th anniversary of UCSD's Department of Visual Arts. Included in the exhibition will be paintings, sculpture, video and performance art. The exhibition continues through May 24.

In addition to David Antin and Jerome Rothenberg, participating artists include Eleanor Antin, Manny Farber, Ernest Silva, Faith Ringgold, Helen and Newton Harrison, Fred Lonidier, Patricia Patterson, Kim MacConnel, Harold Cohen, Italo Scanga, Phel Steinmetz, Babette Mangolte, and Steve Fagin.

In conjunction with the exhibition, a series of lectures will be offered: Faith Ringgold, April 16; Patricia Patterson, April 23, and Italo Scanga, April 30. Each begins at 7:30 p.m. at the University Art Gallery.

Man Without a World by Eleanor Antin and Visible Cities by Babette Mangolte will be screened in the Price Center Auditorium at 7:30 p.m. May 14. All events are free and open to the public.
