Dear Szilard,

I have purposely delayed writing you for it was our agreement in Paris that Jonas get in touch with you to tell you of recent developments. I assume that by now he has done so and that you are au courant.

What do you think of the present amendments to the bylaws? It is our impression that the essence of what we have always wanted is finally there. As for financial support, Jonas assures us it is definite from the National Foundation. We await some sign of a written commitment, but are optimistic that the bottle neck has been removed.

After the meeting in Paris, we wrote immediately to Berger who has agreed to go along. The next persons to be approached will be Paul Berger and after that back to Renato.

Meanwhile Mel and I will remain in Paris until '63 at which time the institute should open. I would be very surprised if Seymour does not come here next year.

Mel and I are working on several lines away from antibody synthesis in vitro trying to use coli extracts and lymph node nuclei acid. Nothing yet.

We love France. I finally see first hand what people have been telling me for years.

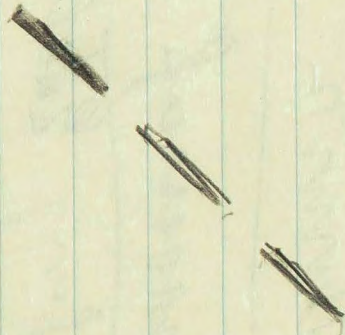
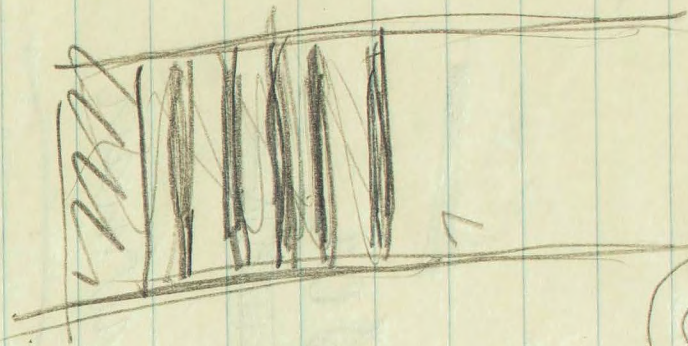

Dear Leo,

This is a tardy response to your letter of March 5 to Jacques.

We all found Weaver's memorandum about the Institute refreshing. The clarity of the statement in the midst of all the previous confusion, made acceptance of delays easier. For me its not the status of the institute planning and building but the confusion and lack of communication that are demoralizing.

We are arriving just now at a new decision point. A meeting is being held March 30 and 31st in La Jolla of all the incide fellows to discuss how to begin. Bonner has written us all letters offering lab space this fall - no strings attached.

Yesterday in Paris, Francis, Jacques, Bruno, Mel and I met to discuss whether and under what conditions to begin in the fall. The consensus was that if we are to have the institute, the sooner we start the better. No one seems very worried about the financial affairs. No one lacked confidence that the affairs in general would be manageable once we were all together.

I shall try to get in touch with you when I am in the States.
