

Morton Feldman is guest speaker in Music series

New York composer Morton Feldman will be the guest speaker in the continuing series "New Music: Critics and Composers" at 8:30 p.m., Monday, April 8 in the Revelle College Formal Lounge at the University of California, San Diego.

The composer's topic is "Feldman on Feldman, or Two Examples of an Indeterminate Music." The series is sponsored by the UCSD Department of Music.

Feldman, who has studied with Wallingford Riegger and Stefan Wolpe in New York, has written numerous works, especially for piano and chamber ensembles. He works with graph notation, as well as traditional notational idioms. One of the cardinal tenets of his art has been "indeterminacy," that is, indeterminate pitch, time and dynamics.

The final speaker in the Music Department series will be Herbert Brun, presently co-director of the Electronic Music Studio at the University of Illinois. Brun's lecture, which will be titled "From Musical Ideas to Computers and Back," will be held at 4:00 p.m., Monday, April 15 in the Matthews Campus Recital Hall.
