APPOINTMENT OF UCSD DEVELOPMENT OFFICIAL ANNOUNCED

George S. (Ted) Peck Jr., currently vice president for University Advancement at the University of Texas at San Antonio, has been appointed associate vice chancellor of Development at the University of California, San Diego. He will assume his new duties Jan. 4, 1999.

In announcing the appointment, James M. Langley, vice chancellor for External Relations at UCSD, noted that "Ted is a mature and poised professional who thinks strategically and acts decisively. I am confident that he will set a clear direction for UCSD's development operation and play a crucial role in helping the university secure the resources it needs to realize its great potential."

In his role at the University of Texas at San Antonio, Peck has program management responsibilities for development, alumni relations, communications, community relations and special events.

"In making the decision to come to UCSD," he said, "I was very impressed by the accomplishments of the university in such a short period of time. I found that the people with whom I talked are strongly committed to the institution and are extremely enthusiastic for what they are about to achieve."

Prior to joining the University of Texas, Peck was senior manager for the Office of Development at Arizona State University in Tempe, Ariz., and vice president of Memorial Hospital Foundation in Houston, Tex. He also has served as director of development at Cullen College of Engineering for the University of Houston, and as executive director of development at Pitzer College in Claremont, Calif.
