5K RAISES FUNDS FOR SCHOLARSHIP; CLEAN CAR FOR CHANCELLOR

While students will benefit by more than \$158,000 in scholarship funds raised by the recent Chancellor's Challenge 5k Run/Walk for Scholars, Chancellor Robert Dynes will benefit by way of a clean car provided at noon Nov. 17 on Library Walk by Associated Students President Tesh Khullar.

The challenge prior to the fourth annual run/walk was for the A.S. president to wash Chancellor Dynes' car if the chancellor beat him; if Khullar had the winning time, the chancellor would host a barbecue.

Khullar lost; the Chancellor came in an admirable 170 out of 872 entries. Frances Dynes Hellman, his wife, came in 202'1. Since Chancellor Dynes had pledged to personally contribute \$25 for everyone who beat him to the finish line, and his wife had promised a personal \$25 donation for every woman who beat her, their contributions were \$4,225 and \$725 respectively.

Additionally, the Chancellor contributed \$40,000 of undesignated funds, and event chair Charlie Robins and his wife, Mary Louise, contributed \$10,000 to match \$50,000 in sponsorships. Included among these major sponsors were Fisher Scientific, Anne Ratner and the San Diego Padres. All proceeds go to support research scholarships and community scholarships for undergraduate students at UCSD.

Among winners in the various 5k categories were Brian Culley, faculty/staff, male; Terry Martin, faculty/staff female; Diment Singh, student-male; Becca Doane, student-female; Walter Schmitt, senior-male; Judy Burt, senior-female; Mike Martinez, sponsor-male; Dyanne Hoffman, sponsor-female.

Next year's run has been set for Oct. 20, 2000.
