

5 from Scripps participate in ocean lectures

Five staff members of the University of California, San Diego's Scripps Institution of Oceanography will participate in a statewide series of 17 lectures on the subject "Ocean Engineering," a University of California extension course for professional engineers, scientists, technical managers, educators, and long-range planners.

The course, which starts the week of February 7 in San Diego, Fullerton, Los Angeles, and Moffett Field, will relate human and military needs to common technological goals in order to support a broad systems approach for managing the complexities of the ocean environment.

In addition to representatives of industry, other educational institutions, and the U.S. Department of the Navy, faculty members will include, from Scripps, Dr. Milner B. Schaefer, professor of oceanography and director of the University's Institute of Marine Resources; John D. Isaacs, professor of oceanography and director of Marine Life Research; Dr. Charles S. Cox, associate professor of oceanography; James M. Snodgrass, research engineer and head of the special developments division; and Dr. Fred N. Spiess, associate director of Scripps, professor of oceanography, and director of the Scripps Marine Physical Laboratory.

Dr. S. Russell Keim, of the Institute of Marine Resources, is San Diego coordinator for the series and a member of its advisory committee.
