Way back in the Fall of 1965, enroute to meet my husband, Roger, in India, I made a visit to my family of five in Bari, Italy. My Italian son-in-law, Dr. Piero Paci, had decided, after several years in Boston hospitals, to return to his native country, where there was a definite need for more doctors. His first position was in Bari, then he practiced in Rome.

One morning, my daughter Mary and I stopped by the office of a doctor, who was also a new friend, living in the same apartment building, to make an appointment for me to get a cholera shot-needed for India. As we entered his waiting room, we became aware of a great deal of turmoil and confusion. One woman was shouting to the harried nurse: "You let that woman in before me, and I've been waiting much longer. I'm going to tear out her bangs when she comes out!" The others seemed fully in sympathy, the nurse was explaining that it was not her fault, that the doctor had called that woman first, but that had no effect in calming the extremely agitated woman. As we sat there, waiting, chatting with the woman next to me, the doctor himself appeared in the doorway. He beckoned to Mary, who went over to him quickly. Meanwhile, I realized that the women, including the most irate one, were all gathered in front of me! I kept stammering (in my very fragile Italian) that I was only trying to get an appointment, and hoped that they were understanding. Meanwhile the doctor was telling Mary not to bother, that he would just come up to their apartment that evening to give me the shot. So we got out of there as fast as we possibly could, luckily unscathed.

The assembled wrath of a group of Italian women can be frightening.

As an example of how erratic my Italian is - one evening during my visit we were invited to a party by that doctor and his wife. Suddenly I was asked the very unusual question for Italians: "How old are you, Signora?" To which I unhesitantly responded: "Cinquecento cinquante"---550, when I really meant to say 55! This delighted everyone.
