


Chula Vista's homes, both large and small, are set in beautiful surroundings.


Eight miles south of San Diego on the shores of San Diego Bay.

Cool summers, mild winters, flowers and vegetables every day in the year.



THE Little Church of the Roses in Glen Abbey Memorial Park is the scene of many weddings because of the beautiful gardens within the church.


SPACIOUS and attractive both inside and out, the Chula Vista Woman's Club is a center for much of the cultural activity of the city.
