

Oceanids received some pleasing correspondence recently. First, Oceanids was proud to accept a certificate proclaiming the following:



UC MERCED CONTROVERSY UPDATE...


In April numerous members asked Al Pentis to write an article on the information he learned during his initial research on the proposed UC Merced campus site and the environmental controversy it has created throughout the state. One Oceanid "response" to Al's article was submitted weeks past deadline and thus could not be included in our May issue, even if approved.

Many Oceanids wanted to know more about vernal pools and the UC Merced campus. Al spoke on vernal pool ecosystems at our Sounding Board in May; he answered many superb questions. Since many of you want to become better informed about both sides of the Merced issue, my solution is to "head off" any "back-and-forth" controversy by directing you to the web sites shown below; you may read letters submitted and even ask questions. If you normally do not access the web, you can go to the public library and receive assistance to search these sites on their computers.

A tremendous amount of factual and interesting information is available on these very current Web sites. Al cautions that one must always consider the interests the authors represent.

One point to bear in mind is that Al found almost no one against UC creating a new campus site - the controversy arises when considering the potential environmental damage and ignoring alternative sites available [since 1995], especially the closed Castle Air Force base site [to be a prison?] with a mostly intact infrastructure and only six miles away. Negotiators now seem to say that the Regents have already chosen the Merced site and say "...it's a done deal..."; reading the web sites you'll find many knowledgeable and prepared groups which do not agree with "...the deal..." Wow!
