FREE PUBLIC LECTURE SERIES ON RACISM. GENOCIDE AND THE HOLOCAUST TO BE HELD AT UCSD FROM APRIL 3-JUNE 5

The University of California, San Diego will host a free 10- week public lecture series beginning in April on "Racism, Genocide and the Holocaust." The series will begin on April 3, with Gerda Klein, a survivor of the Holocaust and the author of "All But My Life." Klein, who will speak on the impact that the war had on her, was rescued from years of confinement in a succession of Nazi slave labor and concentration camps by a U.S. intelligence officer who was later to become her husband. On April 10, SDSU Professor Lawrence Baron, director of the Lipinsky Institute for Judaic Studies, will discuss the dynamics of altruistic personalities in a lecture titled "Dynamics of Decency: Why People Rescued Jews in Nazi Occupied Europe." On April 17, Occidental College Professor Debra Lipstadt will profile people who deny that the Holocaust ever existed in the third lecture in the series titled "They Call Anne Frank's Diary a Fraud: The Tactics of the Holocaust Deniers." All lectures will begin at 7 p.m. in Room 2250 of the Humanities and Social Sciences Building on UCSD's Muir Campus.
