

Dr. J. S. Galbraith to speak at meeting of La Jolla Town Council

Dr. John S. Galbraith, Chancellor of the San Diego campus of the University of California, is scheduled to discuss the progress and the plans of the campus for the people of La Jolla at 8:00 p.m. Thursday, March 11, at a meeting sponsored by the La Jolla Town Council.

The meeting, under the direction of the University of California Committee of the council, will be held in the Muirlands Junior High School auditorium, 1056 Nautilus Street, La Jolla. It is open to the public.

Dr. Galbraith, who assumed the chancellery last December, has been asked by the council to recount the rapid progress, both in buildings and in academics, that has been made since the University Board of Regents authorized the Torrey Pines Mesa area for a general campus in 1959. In addition, he has been asked to outline the immediate and future plans of the campus.

Chancellor Galbraith, a native of Glasgow, Scotland, attended high school in Hamilton, Ohio. He received a B.A. degree from Miami University, Oxford, Ohio, in 1938. At the University of Iowa, Iowa City, he received his M.A. in 1939 and his Ph.D. in 1943. Before coming to UCSD last July as Vice Chancellor and Professor of History, he served as Professor of History at the University of California, Los Angeles.

The La Jolla Town Council is operated by 36 trustees elected from its membership. It is made up of 22 active committees which assist in community problems and projects for the betterment of La Jolla. Through its office at 7923 Herschel Avenue, La Jolla, the council operates a visitors information center open five days a week to assist La Jolla visitors.

Anyone who lives or works in La Jolla may hold membership. The purpose of the organization is to "unify, coordinate, foster and direct the civic, commercial, educational, and general welfare activities of the community of La Jolla."
