My dear Mr. Fletcher:

Again referring to your letter of May 22, 1930, inclosing
petition of yourself and certain other persons as citizens of
San Diego, California, for an order rescinding, vacating, and
setting aside the finding of this Department dated December 22,
1922, in the matter of proceedings instituted by the City of
San Diego, California, under the act of February 28, 1919 (40
Stat. L., 1206), to acquire certain lands within the Capitan
Grande Indian Reservation for reservoir purposes, you are ad-
vised that after full consideration it was found that action in
accordance with the petition was not necessary for the protec-
tion of the interests of the Indians, and accordingly the peti-
tion was formally dismissed February 14, 1931, without prejudice
to any action which the petitioners may now have pending or
which they may hereafter initiate in the courts.
