

## **Dr. Jonas Salk to discuss his current work in lecture sponsored by Revelle Guest-In-Residence Committee**

Dr. Jonas Salk will discuss his work and the current activities of the Salk Institute for Biological Studies in a lecture at 8:30 p.m. Tuesday, Feb. 19, in the Revelle College Cafeteria at the University of California, San Diego.

The program is sponsored by the Revelle Guest-In-Residence Committee and is free and open to the public.

Dr. Salk, developer of the polio vaccine, is founder and director of the institute and also serves as an adjunct professor in the Departments of Psychiatry, Community Medicine and Medicine at UCSD.

Located in La Jolla, the 10-year-old institute conducts basic research directed toward major health problems and is especially concerned with the study of cancer.

The Guest-In-Residence Committee is a special program committee for Revelle College established to bring lecturers to the campus and to encourage student-faculty discussions. Programs conducted by the group are supported by the Revelle Committee on College Affairs.
