to you.



We enclose herewith a copy of our rates and rules, as modified to accord with orders of the Railroad Commission of the State of California.

We request you to read carefully these rates and rules, especially those portions regarding establishment of credit and collections of bills, so that you may thoroughly understand the methods to be used. These rules will be strictly enforced, as the Railroad Commission allows us to make no deviation therefrom.

In conformity with the orders of the Railroad Commission we find that you have been delinquent in the payment of your bills within the twelve months prior to December 1st, 1915, and we are compelled to demand from you a deposit of \$2.00 to guarantee the payment of future bills. This deposit must be made at our office before December 15th, 1915. In case of failure to make such deposit before December 16th, 1915, we shall be compelled to have your water cut off on that date.

These rules having been issued on order of the Railroad Commission, which has control of all public utilities within the State, we trust you will realize that this Company has no choice in the matter but must strictly enforce the rules regardless of any possible inconvenience to consumers.


