RECENT HONORS/AWARDS, UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, SAN DIEGO

John W. Dower, Professor of History and Joseph Naiman Professor of Japanese Studies, University of California, San Diego, received several honors this fall. His book, "War Without Mercy: Race and Power in the Pacific War" was one of the five finalists in the non-fiction category of the 1986 American Book Awards. Professor Dower also was Executive Producer of the documentary film "Hellfire: A Journey from Hiroshima" which has received two prestigious prizes: The Marjorie Benton Peace Film Award, and the Gold Medal for films dealing with Japanese arts and culture in "The 30th Competition for Films on Japan" sponsored by the Japanese Foreign Ministry and Asahi Shimbun newspaper. J. Enrique Luco, Professor of Applied Mechanics and Engineering Sciences, University of California, San Diego, has been awarded the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) Walter L. Huber Civil Engineering Research Prize for 1986. (PROFESSOR LUCO IS A RESIDENT OF ENCINITAS.)
