12th May 1771.

Dear Sir.

Mr Hart has just rec^d yours by the
Williams Capt. Whattle, by which I am glad to hear
you & the family are well. I am much obliged to
you for the things you mention to have sent out
by Cap^t Magness, who is safe arrived in Town. Enclo-
sed you will receive the Mem^r: of Necessaries wanted
for Worcester Estate, & one of a few things I should
be glad if you would have sent out for my own use
in respect to the quantity of each leave it to yourself
to judge what you think necessary. Out of the £200
you were so good as to order Mr Hart to let me have
I hope to save sufficient to buy a good Negroe with
instead of spending it in a foolish manner as I do
say you expect. Mr H^r & myself returned from S^r Town
as last Saturday they still continue to make fine
Sugars at Toyall Williamsfield & Worcester & I hope
will turn out in quantity to your desire. Iowin
does not make such good Sugars as I could wish
altho they are not very bad. We have had for
this fortnight past very fine rains which
has made a very great change in the appearance
of every thing, & has saved many of the next years
Canes. I sent you a Turtle in the dawes Cap^t
Brown which I hope will arrive safe. I should
send you one by this Ship but Mr Hart has sent
one by Cap^t John who sails this day, by whom
