Dear Sir,

Mr Kerr has just rec<sup>d</sup> yours by the  
Williams Cap: Whittle, by which I am glad to hear  
you & the family are well. I am much obliged to  
you for the things you mention to have sent out  
by Cap: Magorefs. who is safe arriv'd in Town. Encl:  
=sed you will receive the Mem<sup>o</sup>: of Necessaries wanted  
for Worcester Potate & one of a few things I should  
be glad if you would have sent out for my own use  
in respect to the quantity of each I leave it to yourself  
to judge what you think necessary. Out of the £200  
you were so good as to order Mr Kerr to let me have  
I hope to save sufficient to buy a good Negroe with  
instead of spending it in a foolish manner as I dare  
say you expect. Mr K: & myself return'd from St Jam:  
=es last Saturday they still continue to make fine  
Sugars at Toyal Williamsfield & Worcester. & I hope  
will turn out in quantity to your desire. I wish  
does not make such good Sugars as I could wish  
altho they are not very bad. We have had for  
this fortnight past very fine rains which  
has made a very great change in the appearance  
of every thing, & has saved many of the next years  
Canes. I sent you a Turtle in the Dawes Cap:  
Brown which I hope will arrive safe. I should  
send you one by this Ship but Mr Kerr has sent  
one by Cap: John who sails this day, by whom



there also is one for my Brother & another for  
Lawrence. I have no other News to tell you than  
William's youngest Brother is, or very near being  
married to a Girl whose Name is Fisher in St  
James's what they will have to live upon after  
what little William has in spent. I cant tell, for  
she has no fortune in the least, & he applys  
himself but a very little to his Business. Give  
my love to my Brothers & Sisters & remember  
me to all enquiring Friends, from
