

UCSD Chamber Chorus and Orchestra to present concert of classical chamber music. Edwin London to direct

February 26, 1973

A concert of classical chamber music featuring the work of Brahms, Isaac, and Mozart will be presented by the University of California, San Diego Chamber Chorus and Orchestra at 8:30 p.m., Saturday, March 3.

The concert, which is free and open to the public, will be held in the Recital Hall, Bldg. 409 on the Matthews Campus.

Director of the chorus and orchestra will be Edwin London, Visiting Professor in the UCSD Music Department from the University of Illinois.

Soloists will be Phoebe Simmons, soprano; Linda Vickerman, mezzo-soprano; Howard A. Crook) tenor; and Philip Larson, baritone.

Mrs. Simmons has toured Europe with the Singing San Diegans and has extensive experience in music comedy and opera. She has performed with the Starlight Opera, San Diego Opera, UCSD Opera Studio and the La Jolla Civic/University Orchestra.

Miss Vickerman is working on her Ph.D. in the UCSD Music Department and is a fellow of the department's Project for Music Experiment. She has many recital, opera, and oratorio performances on both the East and West Coasts to her credit.

Crook and Larson are also fellows of the Project for Music Experiment. Crook has sung professionally in the New York State Theatre and at Carnegie Hall. He is presently singing and performing mime with the New Music Choral Ensemble, a group founded by Kenneth Gaburo of the UCSD music faculty. Larson has performed in ten major operas and with the Choral Associates in New York City.
