

Tryouts for "Peer Gynt", the UCSD winter quarter theater production

Tryouts for "Peer Gynt," the University of California, San Diego winter quarter theater production, will be held at 5:00 p.m. Monday and Tuesday, November 20 and 21, in the UCSD Theatre on the campus.

"Peer Gynt," by Henrik Ibsen, will be presented in March under the direction of Eric Christmas who last year directed UCSD Theatre's successful productions of "Lysistrata" and "The Comedy of Errors." For the past two seasons Christmas has taken part in the Old Globe Theatre's annual Shakespeare festival directing "A Midsummer Night's Dream" two years ago and "Love's Labours Lost" last summer.

"Peer Gynt," considered an epic of world theatre, tells of a wild and imaginative lad who, in his headlong search for identity, leads the audience through a phantasmagoria of adventure.
