

E. Grey Dimond appointed to Medical School Position

Dr. Grey Dimond, head of the cardio-pulmonary division of the Scripps Clinic and Research Foundation, has accepted an appointment as Professor of Medicine in Residence at the University of California, San Diego School of Medicine, it has been announced by UCSD Chancellor John S. Galbraith.

Dr. Dimond, an eminent cardiologist, is one of several physicians associated with the Scripps Clinic who have accepted appointments with the UCSD School of Medicine through a cooperative agreement announced February 14, 1967. The two institutions share certain personnel, services and facilities permitting them to provide a wider range of medical service, research, and medical training.

Dr. Dimond, of 1600 Ludington Lane, La Jolla, received a B.S. degree from Indiana University in 1941 and an M.D. degree from Indiana three years later. He served as an intern and resident at Indiana University before being named a Fellow at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston in 1946.

Two years later he moved to the University of Kansas School of Medicine where, in 1953, he was named Professor and Chairman of Medicine. He left Kansas in 1966 to become a Member of the Scripps Clinic in La Jolla.

Dr. Dimond received the Paul Dudley White Traveling Scholarship in 1956. He also served as a Fulbright Professor to the Netherlands in 1956 and a Visiting Professor to the Institute of Cardiology in London, England, in 1959. He served as President of the American College of Cardiology in 1961, and received the Distinguished Fellowship Award from the American College of Cardiology in 1966.

He is a member of numerous medical societies and associations as well as civic groups. He is a member of the International Center of La Jolla, Inc.; a member of the Board of Trustees of the La Jolla Museum of Art; and a trustee of the Seuss Foundation.

He has written more than 100 papers dealing with cardiology and related subjects.
