UCSD ALUMNUS ESTABLISHES CANCER FUND IN MEMORY OF MOTHER

A generous memorial fund established by a University of California, San Diego alumnus will now provide financial resources for UCSD students stricken with cancer.

David J. Haddad of Beverly Hills, a 1984 graduate, this spring established the Jaye Haddad Memorial Fund in memory of his mother who died of the disease.

"My mom always said people should live every day to their fullest and I hope this money will, in some way, help stricken students live every day to their fullest," Haddad said.

The fund was started with a gift of \$25,000, allowing for approximately \$1,500 to be distributed during the upcoming summer quarter and the 1986-87 academic year, and then annually, according to John W. Steinitz, director of UCSD's planned giving program.

At present, approximately 10 UCSD students in a 14,000 student body are afflicted with some form of cancer, Steinitz said. "This number will escalate as our student population increases.

"It is the intention of David Haddad that The Jaye Haddad Memorial Fund will assist stricken students in meeting some unexpected costs, and thereby help to improve the quality of their lives," Steinitz said.
