A.D.C. RUSSELL - FELL.

This Officer accompanied the patrol from 1/10/74 to 11/10/74. He adapted to this very unfamiliar environment without any problems, and has settled down to complete the patrol solo. He displays a flair for developmental work, and has developed a very commendable working relationship with his patrol staff and the people he is assisting.

RIP.

The patrol assisted the MANSIDES and YOGONDA people with their road project. All of the groups worked well, and the road from MANSIDES to MANSIDES and KIMAPULAN to YOGONDA should prove completely reliable throughout the wet. Unfortunately there is a gap between Mansides and Kingulay that is going to cause problems. This section is in the Wabag Sub District, and the people pay tax to the Wabag Local Government Council. This council has not allocated any RIP funds to the road, and the people display no interest in doing weekly maintenance. There are boggy patches near TAKISENTA that will probably put this road out very shortly.

What it needs is a co-ordinated effort by the Legaip and Wabag councils. The road is important. It serves about 4,000 people, opens up a rich pyrethrum and potato producing area, and leads directly to the proposed Sams Ltd bulk store at Mansides. It also gives access to the PLENS grasslands through YOGONDA, and in about 2 weeks time will be an alternate route to Laisgam through MNEPAP.

When the MNEPAP - YOGONDA road is through (mid December 1974) the Mansides - Yagonda road will be much more of value to the Wabag people than the Legaips, and should warrant the attention of the Wabag Council.

MINOR NEW WORKS.

The base camp at Mansides continues to make slow progress. With the virtual completion of the teacher's house at Taluma, we now have enough artisans, but as usual materials are in chronic short supply. Labour costs have already exceeded the estimates, but as it is certain that many materials will not be delivered this is of no great concern at the moment.

The contractor has commenced construction of the Police Station and 5 IDQ's.

CENSUS.

Census was conducted at KINAPULAM and YOGONDA by Mr. Russell - Fell, who will report separately on this.


LICENSING AND CARDS.

Mr. Addicott's paper on liquor drinking was explained to the people. It did not tell them much that they did not already know, and I did not hear anyone argue against total prohibition. They also want to see playing cards banned again, and vote these 2 things as equally disruptive influences.

POLITICS.

As usual, everyone wanted more wards and more councillors looking after fewer people. I have found this to be a universal trend in the Legaip area.

Self Government, Independence and the constitution was a dead issue that I did not resurrect.

SUMBEI-PUNERA ROAD.

This patrol was conducted mainly to assist the Lalagan L.G.C. in the completion of R.I.P. and road maintenance on the above mentioned road.

Patrol Officer S. Tererebo who started the patrol, only gave contracts to the people on the section of the road from TITIP headwaters to EDIMAN, where LALAGAN/PUNERA road meets the SUMBEI/PUNERA road. Most of the bad bridges have been replaced by Mr. Tererebo with culverts.

The major bridge over the TIT YIP river is half way towards completion. As this is a very fast flowing river, carrying tremendous amount of large rocks, a great number of cement bags have been used to build a very solid wall along each of the banks to avoid later damage. Once this is completed, decking will be laid using timber.

During the three weeks patrol, so many contracts have been given to the people to cut corners and to do general maintenance of the road. Some of these contracts have been completed and have been paid, others still to be paid by P.O. P. Mass, who will be taking over this patrol.

A tractor is now working at Naip with Interpreter Pandan, Const. 1/c Adam and some 70 labourers. The tractor is being used to cut gravel to the sections where corduroy timbers have been laid down. It is also being used for filling up holes on the Mt. Naip section of the road.

On the whole this section of the road is in a very satisfactory condition at present.

The patrol was well received with the exception of an incident at YUMBEI involving the Rest House there which caught fire. The matter is to be investigated by Police.
