

Dr. Leonard D. Garren is PILS Lecturer

Dr. Leonard D. Garren, professor of medicine and director of the Division of Endocrinology at the UCSD School of Medicine, will deliver the seventh lecture in the Professors' Inaugural Lecture Series at 4:15 p.m. on Thursday, February 27, in the Humanities-Library Auditorium, Revelle College.

Dr. Garren's topic will be "On the Role of Protein Synthesis in Hormone Action."

He received his B. S. degree in Biology from the College of the City of New York, his M. S. degree in Endocrinology and Biology from the University of Wisconsin, his D. M. D. degree from the Harvard School of Dental Medicine and his M. D. degree from the Harvard Medical School. He served his internship and assistant residencies in Medicine at Duke University Hospital, Massachusetts Memorial and Massachusetts General.

Until joining the UCSD faculty in 1968, Dr. Garren served as associate professor of Medicine, Yale University School of Medicine.

His research at UCSD includes mechanism of action of hormones, the role of protein synthesis and gene activation and the care of patients with disorders of the endocrine glands with the exception of Diabetes Mellitus.

Dr. Garren's activities off the campus include membership in Sigma Xi, American Federation of Clinical Research, American Society of Clinical Investigation and the Endocrine Society.

The lecture will be free and open to the public.
