U.S.-JAPAN COMPETITION IN HIGH TECH

The Economics Department of the University of California, San Diego is sponsoring a lecture on "U.S.-Japan Competition in High Technology Industry," at 4 p.m., Tuesday, May 14, in the Liebow Auditorium, Basic Science Building, UCSD. The lecture is free and open to the public.

Dan Okimoto of Stanford University and Floyd Kvamme of Kleiner, Perkins, Caufield & Byers, a venture capital company, are the lecturers. Okimoto is a professor of political science and co-director of Northeast Asia U.S. Forum on International Policy. He is a member of the Executive Steering Committee of the Institute for Strategic and International Studies at Stanford and author of "Competitive Edge: The Semi-Conductor Industries in U.S. and Japan."

Kvamme currently serves on the board of Lotus Development Corporation and before joining Kliner, Perkins, Caufield & Byers, was executive vice president of marketing and sales for Apple Computer.
