

UCSD Commencement Exercises planned

June 5, 1969

The University of California, San Diego, will honor 330 graduating students in Commencement Exercises at 10:30 a.m., Saturday, June 14, at Urey Hall Plaza on the campus.

A total of 206 seniors from Revelle College and 34 seniors from John Muir College will receive Bachelor of Arts degrees. The Graduate Division will award 12 Master of Arts degrees, 47 Master of Science degrees and 31 Doctor of Philosophy degrees.

The commencement address will be given by Dr. Roger R. Revelle, Richard Saltonstall Professor of Population Policy and director of the Harvard University Center for Population Studies.

A "Triton Fanfare" played on conch shells, denoting UCSD's Triton mascot and its traditional association with the sea, will precede the processional and open the ceremonies. The processional will be played by a La Jolla ensemble, the Festival Consort, con-posed of Lawrence Selman, John Curtiss, William Lindley, William Mathews and Frank Myers.

Dr. Denis L. Fox, professor of marine biochemistry and University Marshal, will lead the official party, followed by the faculty and students. The procession will march from the Gymnasium to the commencement site.

Greetings to the audience will be given by Dr. William J. McGill, Chancellor of UCSD, and by John W. Oswald, Executive Vice President of the University of California.

Student addresses will be given by Charles H. Seiter, who is receiving a Bachelor of Arts degree in Chemistry, and by William A. Coles, who is receiving a Doctor of Philosophy degree in Applied Electrophysics.

The benediction will be given by the Reverend Ernest Mort, C.S.P., of the UCSD Office of Religious Affairs, and, following the ceremony, the members of the graduating class will be honored at a reception on the lawn north of Urey Hall.
