

## **The awarding of the first two Chancellor's Associates Medals went to Theodore L. Gildred, President of the Gildred Foundation, and James Lemke, vice president of Eastman Technology, Inc**

A new tradition established at the 1983 Chancellor's Dinner-Dance is the awarding of the first two Chancellor's Associates Medals for distinguished service to the University of California, San Diego.

The idea for the awards was suggested by Chancellor's Associate member Marvin Schwartz who also designed, produced and gave the gold medals for the annual awards.

The first two medals, announced at the dinner-dance on Friday, July 8, were awarded by Schwartz and Clayton Brace, current chairman of the Associates. They were given to Theodore L. Gildred, President of the Gildred Foundation, and James Lemkd, vice president of Eastman Technology, Inc., whose contributions of time, talent and resources on behalf of the university during the past year were described as "outstanding and of far-reaching benefit for UCSD."

The presentation for Gildred reads: "Ted Gildred has demonstrated his interest and devotion to this university in a variety of ways. As President of the Gildred Foundation, he made possible the initial gifts which sparked the successful fund raising for the Gildred Cancer Center. Through his interest and support, the U.S.Mexican Studies program was established on campus. During the current year, arrangements have been finalized to locate on the UCSD campus the Institute of Americas. This development entails a \$5 million investment of the Gildred Foundation and includes a building for the Institute as well as the establishment of several endowed chairs. This Center will provide a facility and an organization that will make a major contribution in improving relationships with Latin America."

The presentation for Lemke reads: "Jim Lemke has had a strong interest in linking together the high-tech industry of the area with the Engineering Division of the University. He has been influential in changing some of the emphasis and directions of University Extension; he was the guiding force in getting the Industrial Liaison Program organized. But, the real coup has been his influence, his diligent effort, and persistence in securing the Center for Magnetic Recording Research for this campus. The competition for this Center was very keen among the prestigious research universities, but Jim Lemke deserves the credit for being the decisive influence in securing this valuable resource for UCSD and the community. A potential somewhere in the vicinity of \$11 million will be coming to this campus in the next several years due to the Center's location here."
