

Dr. Carl H. FitzGerald, Assoc. Professor of Math at UCSD awarded a Sloan Fellowship for basic research by Alfred Sloan Foundation of New York

Dr. Carl H. FitzGerald, Associate Professor of Mathematics at the University of California, San Diego, has been awarded a Sloan Fellowship for basic research by the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation of New York.

The Sloan Foundation this year awarded fellowships to 79 young scientists on the faculties of 49 colleges and universities. The new Fellows, whose average age is 30.6, were selected on the basis of nominations from senior colleagues familiar with their capacity to perform outstanding and creative basic research.

Through the Fellowship they will be supported for two years at an average rate of \$8,750 per year. The Fellowships are designed to make possible advances in fundamental research by young scientists at an early stage of their careers.

FitzGerald joined the UCSD faculty as an Assistant Professor in July 1967. Before coming to the San Diego campus he worked as a Teaching Assistant at Stanford University for two years.

FitzGerald received a Bachelor of Science degree from Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1963. He did his graduate work at Stanford University where he received a Ph.D. in Mathematics in 1967.

He is a member of the American Mathematical Society.
