Tamara S. Weintraub, an associate librarian at the University of California, San Diego, has been appointed by Gov. Pete Wilson to serve on the California Library Services Board.

A Republican who resides in La Jolla, Weintraub previously served as a librarian at Mesa Community College and was the assistant librarian at San Diego State University. Additionally, she served on library staffs at Palomar Community College and California State University, Northridge.

She is a member of the American Library Association, Beta Phi Mu honor society and the Medical Library Association.

Weintraub, 30, earned a bachelor's degree in art history from UCSD and a master's degree in library science from the University of California, Los Angeles.

The California Library Services Board was established in 1977 to adopt rules and regulations for operating the state library system, to direct the state librarian in the operation of the system, to serve as the state advisory council for purposes of federal library services and construction, and to establish statewide reference centers. Members do not receive a salary.
