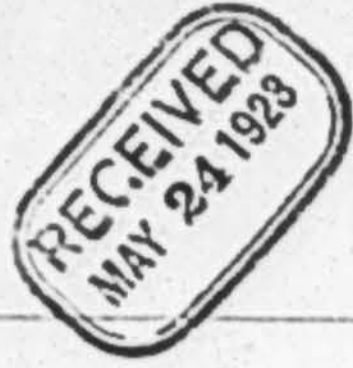

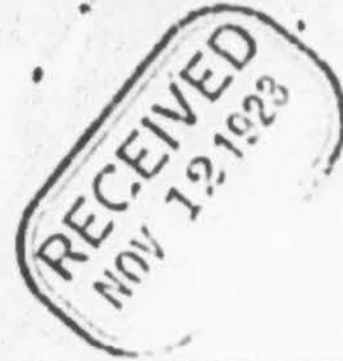
Dear Sir.
