CAPE NELSON PATROL - VILLAGE WATER SUPPLIES.

As per patrol instructions the selected village were visited and inspected with the view to provide safe water in adequate quantities and to make water more readily available to the people.

Water free from contamination may be obtained from wells and where possible wells have been proposed for certain villages. Due to the nature of the ground it would be impractical to install wells in some villages and in these cases alternative schemes have been proposed.

CAPE NELSON PATROL - VILLAGE WATER SUPPLIES.

Herewith list villages inspected.

MARASA: A concrete well similar to the type suggested by the Department of Public Health. Using concrete pipes total cost £62/8/6. Concrete using steel mould £24/10/6.

GEBARA; A concrete tank to store spring water. 5 bags cement £4, gravel and sand (obtained locally).

UTUKWAFU: A concrete tank to store spring water. 5 bags cement £4, gravel and sand (obtained locally).

OROTOABA: Concrete well Public Health type, using concrete pipes £62/8/6, using steel mould £24/10/6.

BAUWAME: Concrete well Public Health type, using concrete pipes £62/8/6, using steel mould £24/10/6.

KONABU: Concrete well Public Health type, using concrete pipes £62/8/6, using steel mould £24/10/6.

SINEI: Concrete well Public Health type, using concrete pipes £62/8/6, using steel mould £24/10/6.

TENIARU: Concrete well Public Health type, using concrete pipes £62/8/6, using steel mould £24/10/6.

KWAPULINA: Concrete tanks with catchment area. 5 bags cement £4, roofing iron £10, gravel and sand (obtained locally).

KASIAWA: Concrete well Public Health type, using concrete pipes £62/8/6, using steel mould £24/10/6.

CAPE NELSON PATROL - VILLAGE WATER SUPPLIES - DIARY

24/10/63; Departed Tufi 0700 hrs per MV 'UBUNA'. Arrived Marasa 0845 hrs. People were all away making copra. Policeman despatched to bring back Councillor. Village water sites inspected. A well had been dug in the village and brackish water obtained, the well was then abandoned. Close to the village is a small stream which the people usually use to obtain their water supplies. The stream was dry and the people had dug a well from which good spring water is obtained. About ten minutes walk from the village is a large creek, water is obtained from it and it is also used for washing.

Afternoon to Gōbara by canoe. Village water sites inspected. People usually obtain water from a creek close to the village but it is dry. Close to the creek are good springs and clean water is obtained from them. The ground around the spring was cleaned and the people were told to keep both the ground and springs clean. Return Marasa. Slept Marasa.

25/10/63: Departed Marasa 0730 hrs per MV 'UBUNA'. Arrived Utukwafu 0845 hrs. Village water sites inspected. Close to the village is a small creek but this is dry and the people obtain their water from an old village site across the fiord, five minutes away by canoe. No well sites in the village as the ground is too rocky.

By Ubuna to Jebo. Walked from Jebo to Orotoaba (40 min.) Village water sites inspected. A creek is located close to the village and water is obtained from it. When the creek is dry water is obtained from springs that are five minutes walk from the village. Return Jebo. By Ubuna to Tainabuna. Slept Tainabuna.

26/10/63: Departed Tainabuna 0730 hrs by canoe. Arrived Bauwame and village water sites inspected. Two minutes walk from the village is a small stream. Water is still being obtained from the stream and when it dries water will be obtained from the source of the fiord, fifteen minutes by canoe.

From Bauwame to Konabu by canoe. Cargo sent to Tufi. Konabu water is obtained from a small stream but this was dry and water was being obtained from Lilioa, also from across the fiord. To Lilioa thence Kofili and Tufi.

2/11/63: Departed Tufi 0730 hrs per MV 'UBUNA'. Arrived Sinei 0830 hrs and village water sites inspected. Water is obtained from a small creek close to the village. The water is poor and contains much muck. Better water may be obtained from a creek closer to Teniaru and the Sinei people were advised to obtain their water from this creek, however they are quite happy to go on using the dirty water. Possible well sites exist in the village although the ground is very rocky.

2/11/63: To Teniaru, water sites inspected. Water is obtained from a creek close to the village. The people had recently made a dam across the creek and a supply of reasonably good water is now obtainable. Possible well sites exist in the village although the ground is very rocky.

From Sinei to Kwapulina by canoe (1hr) in the afternoon. Village water sites inspected. Close to the village are two small creeks one of which is dry, the other about five minutes walk from the village has poor water. As Kwapulina is situated high above the fiord on rocky ground there are no possible well sites near the village. Return Sinei 1700 hrs. Slept Sinei.

3/11/63: Departed Sinei 0730 hrs by canoe. Arrived Kasiawa 0830 hrs and village water sites inspected. Close to the village is a creek from which the people obtain their water. The creek is very small and only a limited supply of water is available. Possible well sites exist in the village although the ground is very rocky. Arrived Tufi 1000 hrs remainder of day observed Tufi station.

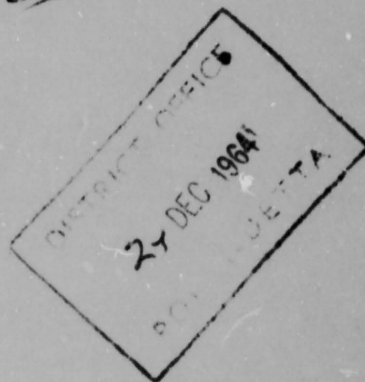

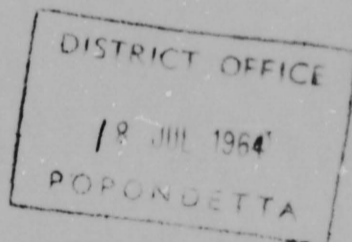



SUMMARY OF CORRESPONDENCE ARISING FROM PATROL

PATROL DIARY

Monday 20th. April, 1964

Departed Tufi per M.V. 'Ubuna' 0715.

Arrived MARASA Village 0915. Village water supplies inspected and cemetery and latrines located. Discussion with village people on availability of water. A storage tank over a good spring a few minutes from the village recommended.

In the afternoon proceeded by canoe to GEBARA, BAIATA and FONIBARU villages in order to investigate a possible project to serve GEBARA. All water supplies inspected and cemeteries and latrines located. Not possible to construct a reasonably priced project within close proximity to GEBARA.

To SINIPARA. Remained overnight.

Tuesday 21st. April, 1964

To UTUKWAFU village by canoe. Inspected water supplies close to the village which are not permanent and unsatisfactory due to possible pollution. Across the fjord about 10 minutes from the village are three streams, two of which give a permanent supply. Recommended that one of these be dammed in a natural rock opening.

To JEBO village by canoe then by road to CROTOABA (45 mins.). Inspected a stream which dries up for part of the year then to a permanent stream which has a spring as its source. A storage tank recommended on this site. There is a natural basin nearby which affords a possible well site however a well would be unnecessarily expensive.

Returned to JEBO then by canoe to TAINABUNA. Overnight.

Wednesday 22nd. April, 1964

To BAUWAME by canoe. Inspected a stream about 5 minutes walk from the village which gives a semi-permanent supply. Latrines and cemetery located. A dam recommended with length of water pipe to allow for access.

To KONABU village by canoe. No suitable site exists for a scheme close to the village. A short distance away at LILLOA No. 2 is an area relatively free of rock and suitable as a well site.

To Tufi arriving at 1230. Overnight.

Wednesday 29th. April, 1964

Departed Tufi per M.V. 'Ubuna' 1400 and arrived SINEI village 1515.

Word sent out to the villages to prepare for the next day. Overnight SINEI.

Thursday 30th. April, 1964

To KWAPULINA by canoe. Ascertained that this village is divided into two hamlets and no decision had been made as to where their permanent site would be. Recommended that no scheme be installed until such time that this is finalised.

In the afternoon inspected SINEI and TENIARU water supplies. At SINEI there is a permanent stream 5 minutes from the village however this is tidal and unsuitable for any scheme. Closer to the village is a stream which is not permanent but could provide water throughout the year if dammed.

At TENIARU there are two streams reasonably close to the village. A well is ~~proposed~~ proposed on the nearer one of these.

Returned to SINEI. Overnight.

Friday 1st. May, 1964

To KASIAWA by canoe(1 hour).

Inspected a stream a short distance from the village which is running most of the year. This is the only supply that is handy to the village. Recommended that a dam be built here. Cemetery and latrines located.

To Tufi by canoe arriving 1200.

END OF PATROL
